Fracture stimulation has been used safely in South Australia since 1969, in both conventional and unconventional wells.

have been fracture stimulated in the deep sandstone reservoirs of South Australia's Cooper Basin.

Australia's first commercial unconventional shale gas well, which started flowing gas in October 2012.

the present sales value of petroleum liquids produced by the South Australian Cooper-Eromanga basins since 1969.



200 tcf gas = 200 year supply

early indicators show that the Cooper Basin could potentially produce more than 200 trillion cubic feet. That's more than two centuries of supply if used in Australia alone.
